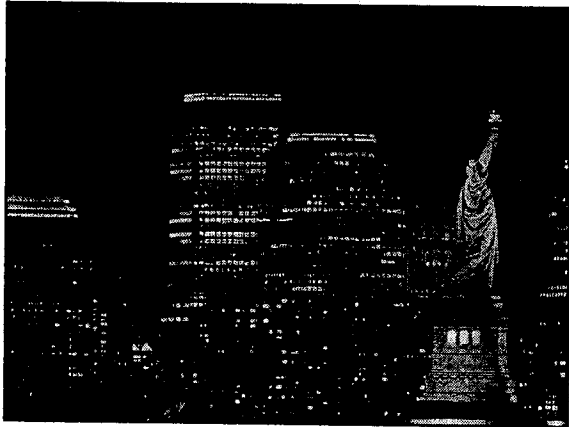

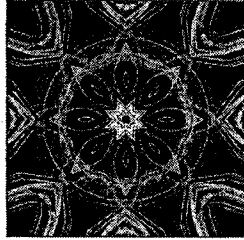

Assumptions

The Facility is responsible for maintaining a safe environment of care

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Assumptions

- Immediate vs. Forecast Hazards
- Partial “decompression” vs. Total Evacuation
- Three Evacuation Plans
 - Horizontal/vertical
 - Close/ “Neighbor”
 - Distant/different risk profile
- “Leavers” vs. “Receivers”
- Evacuation ≠ Transfer

Objectives

- Defined Incident Command System
 - *Planning Branch will be critical!*
- Incident Action Plan:
 - Who?
 - Which cohort?
 - How?
 - Specialty? ALS? BLS? Ambulette? Van? Bus?
 - Where?
 - *Most facilities have a 1:3 or 1:5 need*
 - When?
 - Unstable vs. Stable first
