Rohit Bhalla, MD, MPH

Dr. Rohit Bhalla is Senior Vice President, Chief Clinical and Quality Officer, Stamford Health, a not-for-profit health care system in Fairfield County, Connecticut. In this role, Dr. Bhalla oversees clinical affairs, policy, and programs. He also manages organizational care management, hospital medicine, quality, patient safety, research, and other clinical programs. Prior, Dr. Bhalla served at Montefiore Medical Center for more than a decade as Chief Quality Officer.
